
ATTENTION TENANTS!!

JUST A REMINDER: Driving in the yard can cause damage to the drain field and also ruins the grass. It states in our policies "DAMAGE TO HOUSING PROPERTY" is a lease violation. You will be responsible for any damage that results from driving or parking in your yard. According to policy, the tenant is only allowed vehicles on LCOHA property that are licensed and operable. If you need assistance removing any disabled vehicles in your yard we have phone numbers for different businesses. Please call the office and we would be glad to help you with this.

It is that time of year when you get your award letters from the Social Security Administration office. Just a reminder-if you are due for a recertification with housing this year we will need a *copy of your 2024 Award letter from the Social Security Administration.* We no longer accept bank statements or check stubs. You can bring in your award letters when you receive them. We will make a copy and keep them on file until recertification time. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Housing still utilizes the drop box located next to the front door. You can use this to drop off paperwork, or your rent payment during non -business hours. Envelopes are located in the black box next to the door. ALSO: LCO Public Works has a drop box in the Housing Authority lobby for your water & sewer payments.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY TIPS FOR THE HOME

Hundreds of electrical fires happen each year resulting in countless painful injuries and thousands of dollars in lost property. By following simple electrical safety tips at home, many hazardous solutions can be avoided. Being safe when using electrical appliances, extension cords, light bulbs and other equipment is easy, and safety tips should be included in household rules, homeschool fire safety and daily behavior for all members of the family. It only takes one mistake to spark an electrical fire, but simple prevention measures can be effective solutions. When an electrical short or spark does happen, it is vital to understand what to do to prevent or put out an electrical fire to keep the damage and devastation from spreading. Call 911 or other appropriate emergency services immediately in case of electrical injury or fire. Never touch anyone who is being shocked; the shock can spread through body contact. Know where fuse boxes and circuit breakers are located as well as how to properly operate them. Never attempt electrical repairs or rewiring without proper certification and experience. Do not put water on an electrical fire; use a dry fire extinguisher or baking soda instead.

<u>WARNING SIGNS:</u> You can spot many electrical problems before they cause a fire or shock. Be alert to the following danger signs.

- Recurring problems with blowing fuses or tripping circuit breakers.
- Feeling a tingle when you touch an electrical seasonal light.
- Discoloration of wall outlets.
- A burning smell or unusual odor coming from an appliance or wiring.
- Sizzling sound at wall switches or outlets.
- Flickering lights.

When you spot a warning sign don't wait for an accident. Take action at once. Unplug the malfunctioning appliance if you can do so safely. If necessary, cut off the power to a problem circuit by disconnecting the fuse of tripping the circuit breaker manually and call Maintenance immediately!
